Located 56 kilometers southwest of Cleveland, Ohio, Oberlin College enrolls about 2,900 students, including 350+ international students. Housing is guaranteed for all four years. Oberlin is a 30-minute drive from Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, with shuttle service available.

At Oberlin, you'll find small class sizes; hands-on learning opportunities; and passionate, engaged professors. In fact, our faculty are ranked among the top in the U.S. for their commitment to undergraduate teaching.

Oberlin has a \$63 million budget for U.S. and international aid and meets 100% of demonstrated need.

Oberlin's campus offers the best of both worlds: the coziness of a small college town and access to big-city cultural attractions and restaurants in nearby Cleveland. Everything in Oberlin is within walking distance; many students also have bicycles, and there is a free campus shuttle.


