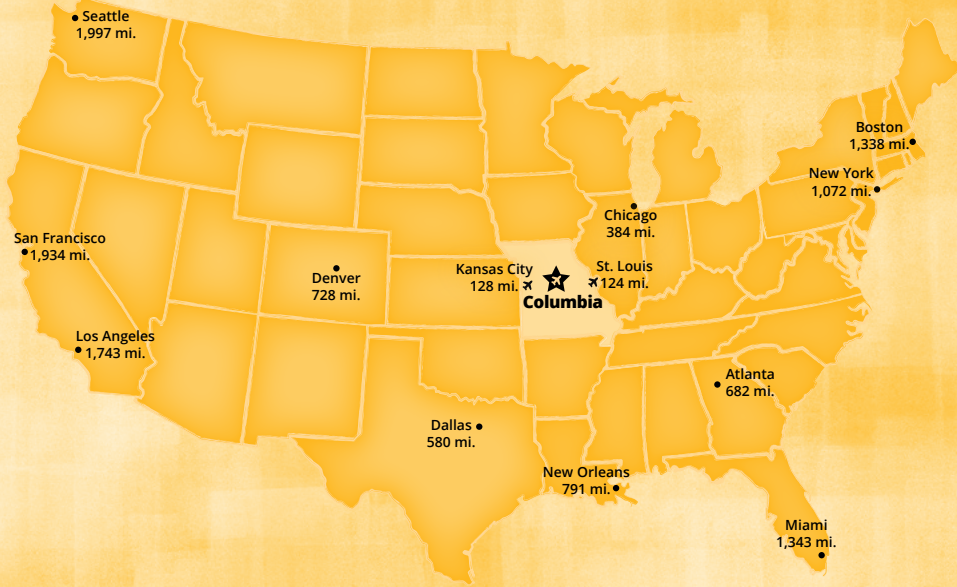

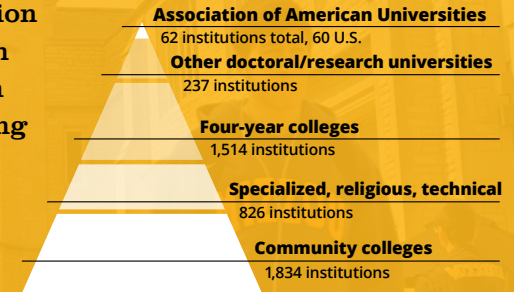

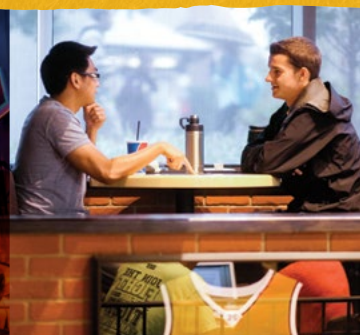

APPLY TO MIZZOU

1. Complete the online application
2. Pay the \$65 application fee
3. Submit the following documents
 - Academic transcripts
 - TOEFL/IELTS scores
 - SAT/ACT scores (not required for admission consideration but necessary for scholarship consideration)

TIMELINE

We recommend you apply six to twelve months before the start of the semester in which you want to enroll.

To be considered for competitive scholarships and admission to the Honors College, be sure to apply by **December 1**.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Every applicant whose native language is not English is required to demonstrate English proficiency by submitting an English exam score.

Mizzou accepts: TOEFL, IELTS, CAE, PTE. Minimum scores are listed below.

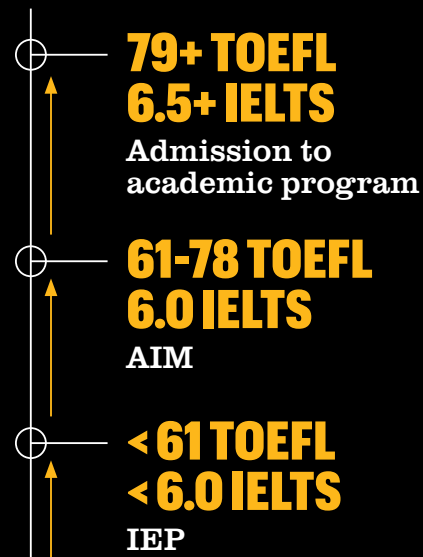
*In the School of Health Professions, the Communication & Science Disorder program requires an English score equal to that required for the School of Nursing.

MU offers a full-time Intensive English Program (IEP) for students who do not meet minimum language requirements for admission, or for any student who wishes to study English as a second language.
